## USAWP Zone Chair Summit Update (Bryan Weaver)

Bryan Weaver attend the USA Water Polo Zone Chair Summit in January and asked questions that the Board submitted in advance when appropriate. He gave a topline highlight on the discussions and topics he felt were timely:

- JO Roster lockdown and the \$100 change fee. Hasn't technology advanced enough to give more time?
  - USAWP staff will look into reducing time.
- Where does this fee go and how much money does it bring in to USA Water Polo?

- Unanswered.
- JO Non- USA players (called Europeans at the meeting)
  - o USA Water Polo says they help non-California teams fill rosters and lend talent to compete.
- FINA New rules. Phasing in where applicable. USA Water polo wanted these changes to make the game faster with more action moments
- USA Water Polo now has 48,000 members
  - o Pacific 8900 up 3%
  - o SoPac 8200 about even to last year
  - o Coastal 6900 down 7% (lost 5 clubs to realignment to Central
  - o Central 5700 up 18% (gained 5 clubs)
- Goalies/Concussions
  - KAP 7 working on a new cap with bubble protection for goalies. Looking into changing equipment rules.
